About Alexandria

▪ Alexandria was built by the Greek architect Dinocrates (332-331 BC) on the orders of Alexander the Great. The city flourished into a prominent cultural, intellectual, political, and economic metropolis. It was the renowned capital of the Ptolemies. It was the site of the Lighthouse, one of the Seven Wonders of the Ancient World, as well as the Great Library. It was along these shores that history took a tragic turn at the time of Cleopatra, Julius Caesar, Mark Antony and Octavian.

Alexandria lies N-W of the Nile delta and stretches between the Mediterranean Sea and Lake Mariut. It is the second largest city and the main port of Egypt. It is one of the most notable summer resorts in the Middle East with beaches of white sands and magnificent scenery and has temperate winters.

Call for Posters

- The abstracts submitted should cover work in fields related to the proposed SESAME activities. Abstract and application form must be submitted to (hussein1@mail.eun.eg) no later than November 1st 2006.
- Abstract guidelines:
 - Abstracts should be no longer than one page (B5) with 2.5 cm margins, single spaced and in Time New Romans font.
 - The title is centered and given in font 16 (bold) and first letter in each word is given in capital letters.
 - The author(s) name(s) is (are) centered and given in font 14 (bold).
 - The affiliation of each author is centered and given in font 11.
 - The corresponding author is designated with an asterisk and his/her E-mail address is given as a footnote.
 - The body of the abstract is given in font 11.
 - Tables, figures and references are not needed.
